


Student Ministry in Slovakia



Heledd Job

Since God brought me to know Him I have had an increasing awareness of Him being a missionary God. The truth that all of history is the story of God's mission to bring people from all nations to himself has captivated me more and more. I've had the privilege of being involved in University Christian Unions in Wales, Portugal and other parts of Europe over the last 10 years and have been excited by seeing what God is doing amongst students. I've also seen the need for more workers, especially in Central and Eastern Europe and have been praying that God would let me be a part of that work. So I count it a privilege to have this opportunity to join in the ministry of IFES (International Fellowship of Evangelical Students) in Slovakia.



Slovakia is a beautiful country and since achieving independence in the early 90s the church has enjoyed more freedom and has seen some growth. But along with that freedom the materialism and apathy of the West has come in and the church is seeing the effect of that. Though the student work grew quickly in the 90s, in recent years groups have

gotten smaller, workers have grown few and the work has weakened. The student movement is made up of 7 student groups ranging from 1 to 20 students, in 7 cities, supported by one full-time worker, Martin. These are students who want to see Jesus being honoured and worshipped in their universities but they often feel very alone and lack confidence.



IFES is all about students reaching students with the gospel. So my aim in moving to Slovakia is to join Martin in building relationships with student leaders, showing them Jesus so that they fall more in love with Him. I hope to help them think of creative ways of sharing Jesus with their friends who don't yet know Him, and to stand alongside them as they do that. My prayer is that we see a growing number of Slovak students living and speaking the gospel in their universities with the confidence that that gospel really is the power of God to save all who believe.

As I think about moving to a new country, learning a new language and working with new people, I am excited but also very, very aware of my own weakness. I know that God's mission of bringing people from all nations to himself will be completed, and yet I am amazed that he chooses to use people like us to accomplish it. Please join me in praying that God would use this ministry in Slovakia to bring many to love, honour and worship him.
